



The Westerman Aboriginal Symptom Checklist (WASC-A) for adults is based upon the acclaimed Westerman Aboriginal Symptom Checklist—Youth (WASC-Y; Westerman, 2003, 2007)

The WASC-Y has been acknowledged as the only uniquely developed, culturally and psychometrically validated test in existence for Aboriginal youth at risk worldwide (Canadian Health, 2009). It has been in use across Australia within mental health services since 2000 and is the measure 'of choice' for numerous federal, state governments, non-government organisations and Aboriginal community controlled health organisations Australia wide. The WASC-A is based upon a similar methodology to the WASC-Y but has been piloted on Aboriginal adults to ensure reliability and validity. It also incorporates items which represent the latest research of relevant risk and protective factors for mental ill health and suicidal behaviours in Aboriginal Australian contexts (Westerman, 2012).

The WASC-A is a self report measure which can be used to screen for risk across five areas including depression, suicidal behaviours, alcohol and drug use, impulsivity and anxiety. The sixth subscale explores for cultural resilience, or factors that protect or moderate the development of risk behaviours. The WASC-A Australia. It has shown good psychometric properties and excellent clinical application. It can be used with Aboriginal people with very low levels of literacy.



320 page Manual is comprehensive and includes current critique and review of available adult Aboriginal Mental Health literature; main outcomes of Dr Westerman's PhD which includes overview of the development of the Westerman Aboriginal Symptom Checklist—Youth (WASC-Y) and WASC-A and validation studies; prevalence data obtained Australia wide from both scales which includes rates of depression, anxiety, suicidal behaviours, drug and alcohol usage, impulsivity and cultural resilience.

The manual also provides an overview of the covariance amongst disorders; the impact of cultural resilience as a moderator of risk; rates of risk for mental ill health amongst youth and adults sampled with the WASC-Y and WASC-A and implications for practice. The manual also includes outcomes of Dr Westerman's initial study and what has been achieved since then from this initial evidence base. This includes an overview of validated culture bound syndromes in Aboriginal populations Australia wide; the development and validation of the Aboriginal mental health cultural competency test (CCT); General Cultural Competency Test (GCCT); delivery of IPS' Cultural Competency Intervention Programs and importantly an overview of the impacts of IPS Whole of Community Suicide and Mental Health Intervention Programs which has been the main focus of the use of the WASC-Y and WASC-A data.

Finally, the manual also provides comprehensive Cultural and Clinical Validation Guidelines which guides the practitioner through cultural best practice as well as culturally appropriate counseling and assessment methodologies for use on the Aboriginal client.

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The WASC-A is initially purchased as a 'startup' pack which includes a the 320 page WASC-A manual and 30 WASC-A forms which covers literature associated with Aboriginal mental health prevalence, assessment and intervention. It also covers the main outcomes of Dr Westerman's PhD which includes an overview of culture-bound syndromes, prevalence data from the WASC-Y and WASC-A; mental health assessment models covered in the workshop and much more. It also includes information on the validation of the WASC-A and WASC-Y.

The manual also includes "Clinical and Cultural Guidelines" which provides practitioners with guidelines to administer the WASC-A at interview stage with at risk Aboriginal people. This includes the provision of specific questions to ask in relation to cultural factors that need to be explored for every item of the WASC-A and culturally appropriate counselling methods and strategies to ensure that the most culturally valid assessment is undertaken. All of this information has been covered in the WASC-A accreditation training you have attended.

Once you have a start up pack, you can then continue to order copies of the WASC-A, which currently come in packs of 30. It should be noted that only those people who have undergone accredited training in the WASC-A are authorised to administer it.

We have done all we can to ensure that costs have been kept at a minimum and to ensure access of the WASC-A to a wide range of service providers. We hope that you will find the packs and associated guidelines of significant benefit in your ongoing work with Aboriginal people.
